Come to know Jesus more deeply with lectio divina

In the reading of Sacred Scripture, especially in the readings of the Mass, we come to know God and His plan for our salvation. We must always remember that Sacred Scripture is inspired, and when we read Scripture, it is truly God's Word speaking to us.

In the tradition of the Church, there is an excellent and reliable method for us to read these sacred books called *lectio divina*. It is an ancient form of praying in Scripture, that literally means "sacred reading". The second Vatican Council emphasized that this should be done by all the faithful. "Let them remember that prayer should accompany the reading of Sacred Scripture, so that God and man may talk together" (Dei Verbum, 25).

To begin, choose a passage of the gospels, for example I usually choose that day's reading for Mass. I call upon the Holy Spirit, asking God to speak to me through the sacred scriptures. *Lectio divina* then involves four simple stages of prayer, each summarized by a Latin word.

- 1. *Lectio*, the actual "reading" of the text. The opposite of speed-reading! Do not hurry. Do not skip words. This may seem obvious, but it is easy to skim through passages, saying 'I read it before' or 'I know the story'. This is dangerous, because when we approach Scripture, we can never force our own meanings on the text, 'what I think it says'. Perhaps read the passage out loud. Read the scriptures as if for the first time, with a certain newness and curiosity, savoring the words. This practice will allow us new insights and a deeper appreciation of the true meaning of the text.
- 2. *Meditatio*, meditation on the passage. For example, if I read a chapter of a Gospel, I will pick out a main passage or thought that struck me this is part of our listening. Pick a main section, no more than ten verses, and reread them very slowly. Sometimes I will even pick out just one key verse. Repeat them. Think and reflect on them. Some may imagine the scene, notice the details and feelings. Listen to the dialogue, hear the questions and answers, make connections to one's life.
- 3. *Oratio*, prayer, our conversation with God. Connect the words of Scripture to Christ who is present. Open to Christ speaking to you in this passage. Sometimes, we need to be silent, listen, and let God's word speak to us; then we will be open to the true meaning of the text, and come to a deeper understanding of God's Word. Is there a challenge, a call, an invitation in this passage? How do I need to respond? How am I to live my life?
- 4. *Contemplatio*, contemplation is the point of the experience of union with God. One moves beyond words and images to God himself. The sacred words are meant to lead us to him. Jesus Christ is the mystery at the heart of the words of Scripture. They point the way to him and inviting all to join him in the communion of faith and love. Contemplation is not relaxation, but rather expectation, being alert to God's presence, made ready for His approach by the previous three steps.





